A guideline for writing an analysis report

- 1. A paper includes
 - 1.1 Introduction
 - 1.2 Content consists of
 - 1.2.1 Analysis of a selected population
 - 1.2.2 Analysis of health situation and problems of the selected population
 - 1.2.3 Identification and analysis of concepts in a selected philosophy you choose to solve the health problems or improve the care for the selected population
 - 1.2.4 Description of appropriateness of a philosophy/ theory of your interest and the implementation of the philosophy/ theory in caring for the selected population, for example; how Islamic philosophy fits with caring for dying Muslim patients hospitalized in the hospital. Research evidence related to the implementation of the concepts in the theory should be provided.
 - 1.3 Summary
- 2. The paper is written in a format according to the Report Writing Manual of Faculty of Nursing, Prince of Songkla University.
- 3. The paper shall not be longer than 15 pages excluding cover page, table of content, references and etc.
- 4. The report is submitted to the course-coordinator one week after the presentation.
- 5. Students are expected to meet the lecturer at the time allocated in the schedule or outside the schedule by appointments.
